

FDL PACKING LIST

CLOTHING

- 4-5 pairs of shorts
- 3-4 pairs of long pants
- 7-9 t-shirts
- 1-2 long sleeve shirts
- 10 pairs of underwear & socks
- 2-3 pajamas
- 3-4 warm tops (sweaters, fleeces, sweatshirts, etc.)
- 1-2 pairs closed-toed shoes (sneakers, hiking boots, etc.)
- 1-2 pairs opened-toed shoes (sandals, Crocs, etc.)
- 2-3 bathing suits
- 1 nicer outfit for Mid-Birthday (only if staying 2 weeks or more)
- rain gear (boots/jacket)
- hat for sun (baseball, bucket, etc.)

UNIFORM

Please note: *These items are **not** necessary for 1-week Try-it I or II or 2-week starter I. They **are** needed for 1-week Try-it 1A and 2-week starter II and III

*Uniforms are worn only for special events and traditions. Items marked with * are required.*

- 1 pair dark green FDL shorts*
- 1-2 white or primarily white collared FDL camp shirts*
- white sneakers*
- white socks*
- FDL sweatpants (optional)
- FDL sweatshirt (optional)

EQUIPMENT

- mesh laundry bag
- bedding
 - 3-4 blankets
 - 2 sets of twin sheets
 - 1 pillow with 2 pillowcases
 - sleeping bag (to be used for extra blanket & campouts)
- 2-3 shower towels
- 2-3 beach towels
- toiletries in a small bucket
 - toothbrush
 - toothpaste
 - shampoo & conditioner
 - body wash
 - hairbrush
 - feminine hygiene products
- sunscreen
- insect repellent
- 2 flashlights or headlamps with extra batteries
- 2 reusable, dishwasher safe water bottles
- small day backpack

OPTIONAL

The following is a list of fun/comfort items to have at camp but are not required:

- camera (digital or disposable)
- letter/postcard writing materials
- stamps
- books
- nail polish
- friendship bracelet supplies
- swim goggles
- pop-up mosquito netting (see examples here: www.walmart.com, www.amazon.com)
- stuffed animal
- musical instrument
- sports equipment, including personal safety equipment such as eye or mouth protection.
